Studies show that, while women make up 47 percent of the U.S. workforce, almost three guarters of the transit workforce is comprised of men. Among technicians, skilled craft workers, technicians, and service and maintenance workers, the gender disparity is more severe, with men comprising 95%, 76%, and 71% of these job categories, respectively. Though less pronounced, these same jobs categories continue to suffer from a lack of ethnic diversity, particularly among people of Hispanic, Asian, American Indian/Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander origin. Learn about agency-level outreach initiatives to bring women and people of color into the maintenance field.
