“Preparing An Innovative Clean Transit (ICT) Exemption Request”

Join us for an engaging webinar dedicated to understanding how to request exemptions from the Innovative Clean Transit (ICT) regulations. Our expert speakers will share valuable templates for exemption requests and outline the criteria for eligibility.

The ICT regulation, adopted in December 2018, mandates that all public transit agencies gradually transition to a fully zero-emission bus (ZEB) fleet. Starting 2029, 100% of new bus purchases by these agencies must be ZEBs, with the ultimate goal of complete transition by 2040. This regulation applies to all transit agencies that own, operate, or lease buses with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) exceeding 14,000 lbs, encompassing standard, articulated, over-the-road, double-decker, and cutaway buses.

Key requirements of the ICT regulation for transit agencies include:

- Submission of a ZEB Rollout Plan, approved by the agency's Board, outlining the strategy for achieving a full transition to zero-emission technologies by 2040. Large agencies must submit their plans by July 1, 2020, and smaller agencies by July 1, 2023.
- Opportunities for ZEB purchases, with various exemptions and compliance options to support transit agencies' flexibility.
- Adherence to annual reporting and record-keeping requirements.
