
Monterey-Salinas Transit


MST Public Private Partnerships Annual Boardings

- City of Monterey/Aquarium Trolley: 140k pax
- Hartnell College Free Fare Zones: 70k pax
- CSU Monterey Bay U-PASS: 200k pax
- Amtrak, Santa Clara VTA Line 55: 30k pax
- Department of Defense 700k pax & growing
 Total Partnership Passengers: 1,140,000

- to support transit services for veterans, seniors, and persons with disabilities for 15 years.
- Estimated dollars raised over the life of the tax: \$100 Million (2012 \$)
- Nov 2014 72.6% overall support
- 100% of funds go to MST
- First county-wide sales tax to pass ever



- •3/8 of one-percent countywide sales tax to support local roads, regional mobility, and transit services for youth seniors, working families and persons with disabilities for 30 years
- •Estimated dollars raised over the life of the tax: \$600 Million (2015 \$)
- Nov 2016 67.7% overall support
- 60% goes directly to cities/county for streets and roads
- Approx 7% to MST mostly capital projects, but some operations in the Salinas Valley for commuter bus and/or vanpools
- •4th attempt for roads/transit sales tax
