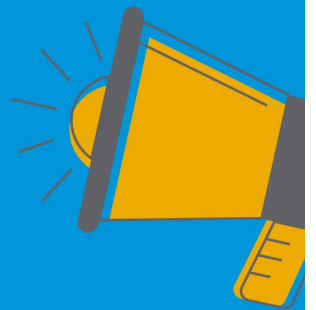
Pedal Power

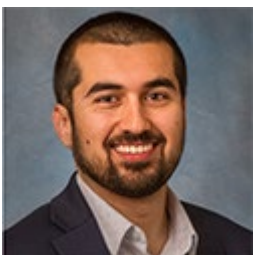
