



Transit Watch: Public Transit in Crisis

Friends,

The alarm bells are ringing! Caltrain, a critical public transportation option for millions of workers traveling in and through Santa Clara, San Mateo, and San Francisco counties, is in danger of shutting down due to the impacts of the coronavirus pandemic.

Without funding assistance from the state or federal government, the agency may be forced to close its doors and cease operations indefinitely. Caltrain is one of dozens of public transportation agencies statewide facing this existential crisis.

Are we headed toward a California without transit?
