

Transit Watch: Public Transit in Crisis

August 4, 2020

Friends,

This afternoon, a diverse coalition of more than 30 labor, social justice, disability rights, environmental, transportation, and business leaders <u>submitted a letter to Congressional leaders and California's Congressional delegation</u> requesting at least <u>\$3.1 billion in emergency funding for California's transit agencies</u> to help prevent devastating service reductions.

This diverse show of support is crucial to our efforts to secure emergency funding for California transit agencies as part of a larger emergency federal funding package that includes new funding for transit agencies nationwide. <u>As we previously highlighted for you, the \$1 trillion "Health; Economic Assistance; Liability Protection; and Schools Act,"</u> released last week, does not currently include emergency funding for the nation's public transit agencies.
